

## **Rev. Delmar B. Hutson**

(September 24, 1929 - April 20, 2014)

Rev. Delmar B. Hutson of Steelville, MO was born on Tuesday, September 24, 1929 in Gray Summit, MO to Otis Hadley Hutson and Martha Elizabeth Bell Hutson. He passed away on Easter Sunday, April 20, 2014, at 11:15 AM – the time at which years prior he would have been stepping up to the pulpit - at the age of 84 years, 6 months, and 27 days. Delmar graduated from Cherryville High School in the class of 1947. He accepted Jesus as his Savior in high school, was baptized in Crooked Creek in Sligo and was licensed to the gospel ministry at age 17. He attended Southwest Baptist College in Bolivar, MO during the summers while he taught public school at Short Bend, Carr, Cours Station, Huzzah, Wesco, Cuba, and Steelville. He married Dorothy Marie Pinnehort September 8, 1952 in Salem, AR and to this union two sons were born. Delmar pastored for more than 50 years beginning his ministry at Shepherd Hill Baptist Church, rural Cuba, MO, Crossroads Baptist Church, Leasburg, MO for 14 years then Center Point Baptist Church, Steelville, MO for 30 years, retiring from there in 1998.



It seemed like for many years Delmar pastored the communities of Leasburg and Steelville. He married and buried hundreds of family friends over the last 60+ years. Delmar was active in the Steelville community and was involved in many business ventures. He was a member of Lebanon Lodge #77 AF&AM, and the St. Louis Scottish Rite Club. Delmar was a deputy for Johnny Giles and served as juvenile officer in Crawford & surrounding counties for 10 years. In his 80's, Delmar could out-work most 50-year-olds. He was strong, hard-working, and was skilled at building and fixing most anything. Delmar liked to buy/sell cars and motorcycles, and at one time had a car lot. He was quite a "horse trader," and had fun going to auctions. For many years, he had horses and enjoyed trail rides. He loved riding 4-wheelers and camping with his boys. Deer hunting with friends and family at the cabin were a constant throughout his life. In fact, the day he had his first "spell," he was working on the cabin getting it ready for deer season. He was great with babies and children and had a way of making his grandchildren smile and rocking them to sleep. Delmar loved spending time with his boys and provided them many toys through the years; Tonka trucks, ponies, horses, motorcycles, and 4-wheelers. But, the greatest gift he gave them was being a loving father who demonstrated God's love and lived out his faith till the end.

Delmar and Dorothy purchased Economy Shoe Store in Steelville in 1952 from Buster Hewkins and Jay Garms, added clothing merchandise, and became Hutson Economy Store. In 1957, Delmar's dad bought Hayes Shoe Store in Steelville and merged the business into what became known as Hutson's Department Store. Since he was a bivocational pastor, he didn't really have an office. Countless times, he met with and counseled people back in the shoe department. The family spent so many hours there - most people just came to the store to visit them. Delmar and Dorothy's life revolved around the churches they served and the store they raised their boys in. After 36 years, they closed out Hutson's Department Store in 1988. In 1989, the family opened Hutson Funeral Home in Steelville and in 1990, Hutson Funeral Home in Cuba. Delmar and Dorothy have been active in the business the whole time with their sons and families. Delmar was preceded in death by his parents, his in-laws James Lloyd Pinnell, Grace Coleman Pinnell and Marie Simmerly Pinnell; three brothers-in-law, Eugene Schmidt, Lindell Bouse, and James Haskell Pinnell; and one great grandson Jubilance Divine Griswold.

He is survived by his loving wife of 61 years, Dorothy of the home; two sons, Spencer (Valerie) of Cuba, Paul (Pam) of Steelville; five grandchildren, Brooke Hutson (Timothy) Gibson of Black Mountain, NC, Brett (Auburn) Hutson of Queens, NY, Rheanne (Matt) Griswold of Southwest, MO, Kayla (Josh) Nix, and Paula Hutson (Aaron Ransom) of Steelville, MO; eight great grandchildren, Jude, Simone, and Roxie Hutson, Whitman and Chamblin Gibson, Jace, Kaden, and Hutson Griswold; two sisters, Blanche (Freeman) Burrus of Salem and Jean (Bill) Talbert of Steelville; sisters-in-law and brother-in-law, Lorraine Pinnell of Villa Ridge, MO, Ina Bouse, Rosie (Ray) Atchison, Elizabeth Schmidt all of Steelville, MO; uncle Lawrence Hutson of Columbia, IL; nieces, nephews, other relatives and many friends, all who will sadly miss and fondly remember Delmar Hutson.
