Jonathan T. Wilson Dies at Home of His Daughter Monday.

Came to Livingston County When a Boy and Had Resided Here Practically His Entire Life— Was 90 Years Old

Johnathan T. Wilson, 90 years old and one of the oldest residents of Livingston county, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. B. F. Wietrick in Weston Heights Monday evening at 5:30 o'clock. A short time before he passed away he called his wife and children, John Wilson, May, Okla.; William Wilson, Hale; Albert, Luther, Arthur Wilson and Mrs. Wayne Stucker and Mrs. Wietrick, all of t...is city, to his bedside and bade them goodbye. Two others daughters, Mrs. Eliza Ishmael, May, Okla., and Mrs. J. S. Dawkins, Deora, Colo., were unable to reach here before his death. Funeral services will be held from the Elm Street Methodist Church conducted by the pastor, Rev. Hanes, Wednesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Interment in Edgewood.

Mr. Wilson's death had been expected for several days. He had been bedfast several weeks and at his advanced age the family had realized the end was near.

The deceased was born near Ports-

mouth, Ohio, December 11, 1833 and came to Livingston county when a boy. Sixty-ix years ago last Saturday, May 10, he was married to Mary A. Christman. He had lived in Livingston county his entire life with the exception of 20 years spent in Oklahoma. For years Mr. Wilson was in charge of the old Slagel and Collier grist mills. He also followed farming.

He was a great lover of music, play ing a violin which he greatly enjoyed during the latter years of his life.

Besides his wife and children he is survived by 56 grand children and 102 great grand children.
